According to the Bank's website, the general objective is to strengthen regional economic integration in Central America, through the use of digital instruments for the interoperability of national and regional processes and systems focused on consolidating the implementation and use of the PDCC. Two specific objectives have been defined: (1) strengthen the functionalities of the PDCC, its interoperability and the use of the platform as a consolidated regional system of services and/or processes related to intra- and extra-regional trade; and (2) implement related developments to expand the capabilities of the PDCC, including a module for the automation of the Central American technical regulation process.
