The specific objectives of the TC are: (i) support the generation of knowledge products defined within the working groups and the Coalition's Biennial Action Plan; and (ii) contribute to the dissemination of these products to establish a common knowledge base among the members of the Green Coalition and other interest groups in the Amazon.
