Project Description

According to the IADB, the objective of this Technical Cooperation (TC) is to strengthen the capacity of labor market and social protection policies to prepare for and respond to extreme weather events, environmental degradation, and biodiversity loss in Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC). The specific objectives are to: (i) estimate the effect of extreme weather events, environmental degradation and biodiversity loss on labor markets and poor and vulnerable households, using geospatial data, and provide actionable insights to align these policies to national mitigation and adaptation commitments (ii); strengthen the adaptation capacity of labor market and social protection programs and services by developing and evaluating interventions in selected countries and, (iii) disseminate and exchange good practices and experiences between LAC countries.
