Project Description

According to IADB, this Technical Cooperation (TC) will strengthen the work plan of the Forum of Amazonian Cities, considering the opportunity to highlight urban issues in the Amazon through the United Nations Climate Change Conference, Conference of the Parties (COP30), in Belem, Brazil, in November 2025.
