Project Description

According to the IADB, the general objective of this Technical Cooperation (TC) is support collective action by financial authorities in Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) to enhance digital financial inclusion by strengthening Digital Public Financial Infrastructures (DPFI), building institutional capacity through shared digital solutions, regulatory best practices, and promoting regional policy-relevant knowledge. To this end, the TC will implement regionally oriented initiatives with the specific objectives of: (i) promoting collective definition of regional principles, and convergence of standards and regulatory frameworks for payments, open finance, or other fintech services; (ii) supporting the development of regional DPFI to expand access to digital payments or open finance, drive innovation, and enable interoperability, integration, and practical use cases; and (iii) building institutional capacities and fostering public-private dialogue.
