Project Description

According to the IADB, the general objective of this Technical Cooperation (TC) is to support the preparation and execution of the investment loan "Energy Transition and Integration Program for Suriname, SU-L1074". The specific objectives of the TC are to: (i) carry out detailed technical, economic, social and environmental studies of the infrastructure to be financed by the loan namely, a transmission line, a solar PV plant, and improvements to the distribution grid; (ii) provide technical support for the execution of the operation; and (iii) facilitate the dissemination of best practices and solutions for electricity transmission and access to basic services in the Suriname's interior regions.
