Project Description

The specific objectives of the project are: (i) expand access to child development centers that meet quality standards by children between 0 and 3 years of age whose families have low incomes; (ii) expand the coverage of the Uruguay Crece Contigo program, aimed at promoting good parenting practices and greater access to and use of public services by families with children at socio-health risk; and (iii) increase the income of critically deprived households with children between 0 and 3 years of age.
