Project Description

The proposed transaction with JMMB Bank Ltd ("JMMB Bank") consists of a senior unsecured financing of up to US\$35 million with a tenor of up to 5 years, to be funded by IDB Invest. The use of the proceeds will be to finance the growth of its SME and low- and medium-income housing portfolios in Jamaica. As a complement to this financing, IDB Invest will support the growth of JMMB Bank's women-led SMEs through a technical assistance component.

A financial intermediary then lends these funds to their clients (private actors) in the form of loans, bonds, guarantees and equity shares.
