## Project Description

The project consists of designing, maintaining and operating the water and sewage system in the municipalities of Paco do Lumiar and Sao Jose de Ribamar, in the state of Maranhao. The aim, in addition to universal water distribution, is to achieve 90% sewage collection and treatment for approximately 328,000 people. The financial plan consists of an IDB Invest loan of up to R\$ 500 million, of which R\$ 250 million will be guaranteed by the French Development Agency (Proparco) with a term of up to 20 years.
