## Project Description

Companhia Brasileira de Fertilizantes (“Cibrafertl,” the “company”, <http://www.cibra.com>); the Brazilian manufacturer of granulated superphosphate and fertilizers blender headquartered in Salvador, Bahia; is the 5th largest fertilizer company in Brazil, and holds 3% of the market share. In August 2015, Cibrafertl acquired Agroindustrial São Luiz which more than tripled the size of Cibrafertl from 370k tons to 1,200k ton total annual capacity.

IFC’s proposed investment includes a corporate loan of up to US\$ 40 million. The proceeds of this investment will be used to support the company’s investment program in 2016-2017, including (i) upgrading the existing SSP manufacturing facility at Camacari, Bahia; (ii) upgrading existing blending facilities; (iii) acquiring brownfield blending assets; and (iv) working capital needs.
