Project Description

According to the IFC, the proposed investment consists of a (i) US\$184 million ten-year senior unsecured Sustainability-Linked A Loan and (ii) up to US\$600 million B1 Loan to Companhia de Saneamento Basico do Estado de São Paulo. IFC use of proceeds consist of financing twenty seven subprojects or components that are part of the "Integra Tietê Program", one of the most relevant sanitation programs in the country, which aims to improve the Tietê River environmental quality by connecting households to the wastewater collection and treatment systems (collectively referred to as the "Project" in this ESRS), therefore avoiding the discharge of untreated sewage into the river.
