Project Description

According to the IFC, the proposed investment consists of a senior unsecured A Loan of up to US\$150 million and a B Loan of up to US\$150 million to Banco Santander (Brasil) S.A. (“Santander Brasil” or “the Bank”), an existing IFC client since 2009. The proposed investment aims to complement the Bank’s lending to sustainable projects, with a focus on (i) assets eligible under the Brazilian Government’s Eco Invest Program (“Eco Invest”) and (ii) blue assets, supporting the blue economy. Other sustainable asset categories are also expected to be eligible under the facility such as hybrid and electric vehicles for individuals, sustainable agribusiness practices, and solar panels for individuals (and potentially small and medium enterprises for self-consumption).



Investment Description

- International Finance Corporation (IFC)

The proposed investment consists of a senior unsecured A Loan of up to US\$150 million and a B Loan of up to US\$150 million to Santander Brasil, to support lending to sustainable projects, with a focus on Eco Invest and Blue projects.

Financial Intermediary

Financial Intermediary: A commercial bank or financial institution that receives funds from a development bank. A financial intermediary then lends these funds to their clients (private actors) in the form of loans, bonds, guarantees and equity shares. Financial intermediaries include insurance, pension and equity funds. The direct financial relationship is between the development bank and the financial intermediary.
