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## Project Description

The project is expected to (i) reduce Belem municipality's consumption of electricity and greenhouse gas emissions, including CO<sub>2</sub>, through the use of energy-efficient lights and advanced streetlighting management systems; (ii) expand street lighting services to underserved communities in the municipality; (iii) reduce safety risks related to poorly lit streets; (iv) improve lighting quality and lower the frequency of service interruptions; (v) improve infrastructure for the illumination grid, modernizing it and integrating features as previously developed in smart cities; and (vi) promote overall urban improvements.
