Project Description

As stated on the project disclosure page, the IFC entered into a collaboration agreement with McEwen Copper Inc., and Andes Corporacion Minera S.A. (ACMSA) whereby IFC will collaborate with McEwen Copper Inc. and ACMSA to enhance the standard of the Regulatory Local Environmental Impact Assessment of the Los Azules project (as further described below) and guidance on preparing an Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) for the Los Azules project aligned with the IFC Performance Standards.

The Los Azules project is a feasibility stage copper project located in the San Juan province, Argentina, aiming to produce high-purity copper cathodes. It is regarded as one of the largest undeveloped copper projects globally. Once in operation, the Project aims to differ from conventional copper mining projects by using less water, emitting lower carbon, and being 100% powered by renewable energy.

McEwen Copper Inc. aims to create one of the first major copper projects to be designed around regenerative principles from the ground up by employing modern low-emission technologies, renewables energy and prioritizing solutions that enhance the environment and communities. McEwen Copper Inc. is a private mining company primarily engaged in the development of the Project and the Elder Creek exploration project in Nevada, USA. McEwen Copper Inc.'s interest in the Project is held through ACMSA, a wholly owned subsidiary, which owns 100% of the Project's development rights and associated holding and mineral concessions and easements.

The environmental and social scope of work for the Collaboration Project includes:

- (i) an E&S site visit and a high-level E&S risk screening of the Project by the IFC E&S team aiming to better understand the mining Project's potential environmental, health, safety and social impacts on the natural environment and surrounding communities;
- (ii) the assessment of McEwen Copper Inc.'s plans and strategies to properly derisk the Project and determine if there are any gaps with respect to IFC requirements, E&S actions and conditions for investment;
- (iii) development of an implementation plan by providing an initial set of E&S suggestions to reduce uncertainties around the main E&S risks of the Project, ensuring adequate prioritization of actions;
- (iv) preparation of terms of reference and support in the identification and selection process of a consultancy firm to prepare a bankable ESIA;
- (v) support during baseline data collection and intermediary review of impact studies and mitigation plans. IFC's role in the Collaboration Project explicitly excludes the preparation of the IFC-compliant Environmental, Social, Impact Assessment report and/or any other Environmental and Social documentation.



People Affected By This Project

Centre for Human Rights and Environment (CEDHA) have filed complaints to Canada's Corporate Social Responsibility Counsellor accusing McEwen Mining of disregarding glacier impacts at its Los Azules Project in San Juan province. In a [published study](#), CEDHA found McEwen Mining is intentionally misleading shareholders on its [corporate website](#), falsely claiming "there are no ice glaciers present in the project area", while at the same time, carrying out a multi-year inventory and analysis of the glaciers for the Los Azules project.

This research found that:

- **At least 6 rock glaciers have already been directly impacted** by exploratory roads
- **Additional glaciers may have been affected** by drilling and infrastructure
- Planned mining activities pose further risks:
 - **Open-pit excavation overlaps with glacier areas**
 - Potential **melting of permafrost and rock glaciers**, altering hydrology
 - Increased **runoff and sediment flow into rivers feeding the San Juan basin**

The company McEwan mining also has a track record of corporate violations in other projects. More recently in 2025, in Canada, the company faced **legal action from the Apitipi Anicinapek Nation** over its Black Fox mine, with allegations of **breaching an Impact Benefit Agreement, unpaid obligations, and environmental harms linked to tailings seepage affecting local waterways and aquatic life**.
