## Investment Description

- IDB Invest (IDBI)

The Project consists of a total financing package of up to US\$30 million to support the small and medium enterprises (“SMEs”) strategy of Banco Agrícola, S.A. (“Banco Agrícola”). The Inter American Development Bank Group (“IDB Group”) will participate through an unsecured A Loan of up to US\$18 million with a four year term and includes the participation of B Lenders for up to US\$12 million.

## Financial Intermediary

Financial Intermediary: A commercial bank or financial institution that receives funds from a development bank. A financial intermediary then lends these funds to their clients (private actors) in the form of loans, bonds, guarantees and equity shares. Financial intermediaries include insurance, pension and equity funds. The direct financial relationship is between the development bank and the financial intermediary.
