Project Description

On March 10, 2021, MIGA issued a guarantee for US\$67.5 million to Tulu Moye SAS of France to cover its equity and quasiequity investments in Tulu Moye Geothermal Operations Plc of Ethiopia against the risks of Breach of Contract, Expropriation and War and Civil Disturbance for a period of up to 15 years. Tulu Moye SAS is jointly owned by Meridiam SAS of France and Reykjavik Geothermal Ltd. of Iceland. In this project, MIGA will share a first loss layer with the IDA Private Sector Window MIGA Guarantee Facility.

The Project involves the design, development, construction, operation and maintenance of Phase 1 of an up to 150 mega-watt (MW) greenfield geothermal power plant in the Oromia region of Ethiopia, located approximately 100 kilometers southeast of Addis Ababa.

The Project is a Category A under MIGA's Policy in Environmental and Social Sustainability (2013) because it has potentially significant adverse environmental and social (E&S) risks and impacts. The most significant E&S risks include: land acquisition and involuntary resettlement; impact on water resources (water use and effluent discharge); waste generation (e.g. drill cuttings/fluids); impacts on biodiversity; air, noise and nuisance odor emissions; and occupational and community health and safety.
