# **Project Description**

According to bank documents, the project objective is to sustainably restore agricultural livelihoods, reconstruct critical public infrastructure to improved standards in the flood-affected districts, and improve the Government of Malawi's disaster response and recovery capacities.

The project has four components:

- 1. Livelihoods restoration and food security. That component is comprised of two sub-components:
  - i. labor-intensive community infrastructure repair and
  - ii. restocking of the strategic grain reserve.
- 2. Infrastructure rehabilitation and reconstruction. Four sub-components comprise this one:
  - i. reconstruction and improvement of roads and bridges
  - ii. irrigation and rural water supply and sanitation,
  - iii. water resource management
  - iv. rehabilitation and reconstruction of education and health facilities.
- 3. The third component, promoting disaster resilience, contains two sub-components. They are:
  - i. institutional strengthening of Department of Disaster Management Affairs (DoDMA) and
  - ii. multi-sector design of disaster resilient infrastructure.
