Project Description

The project aims to support the Government of Vietnam in mangrove forests restoration, focusing the central, northern central, and the Red river delta regions.

The three elements, according to the Bank are:

- (i) “putting in place modern and improved systems for planning, providing inputs for, and financing restoration of coastal forests,
- (ii) investing in more effective management arrangements, and in the cultural practices and structures need to extend and manage coastal forests and augment their survival, and
- (iii) diversifying the long-term benefits from protecting and maintaining the coastal forests. The project will promote the use of modern approaches to motivate these changes, including modern monitoring systems, market driven payments for ecosystem services, promotion of improved planning, modeling-based determination of site level investments, and upgrading production systems for coastal commodities and promoting integrated value addition.”

The component 1 will be implemented at the central level. Components 2 and 3 will be implemented at the sub national (provincial, district, and commune) level
