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Project Description

The bank document stated that "the objective [of the project] would be to finance new infrastructure systems that will improve the ability of the Government to actively manage water levels in the case of intense rainfall or droughts." and "Four river basins have been selected as priority for the implementation of the investment plans. The four river basins include: Kelani Ganga, Attanagalu Oya, Mahaweli Ganga (downstream of Minipe diversion); and Mundeni Aru."

Component 1: Flood and Drought Risk Mitigation Investments

The objective of this component will be to reduce the vulnerability of the people and infrastructure in areas with high flood and drought risk.
