### **Project Description**

The development objective of Reintegration of Ex-Combatants Project for Central African Republic is to support the social and economic reintegration of demobilized ex-combatants and improve access to socio-economic infrastructure and economic opportunities for host communities. This project has three components. 1) The first component, Social and Economic Reintegration Support, aims to be supported by the sensitization activities detailed in Component 3. It has four subcomponents as follows: (i) Orientation, Counseling and Skills Training; (ii) Start-up Reintegration Support; (iii) Follow-up Reintegration Support; and (iv) Support to Vulnerable Ex-combatants. 2) The second component, Support to Host Communities, aims to support the rehabilitation or construction of small-scale social and economic infrastructure in the host communities. It has two sub-components as follows: (i) Improvement of Socio-economic Infrastructure; and (ii) Capacity Building for Host Communities. 3) The third component, Project Management, will consist of the following activities to support Project Management: (a) capacity building, (b) sensitization and communications, (c) environmental and social safeguards management, and (d) monitoring and evaluation (M and E).
