Component 2: Risk Reduction and Resilient Investments

Component 3: Disaster Risk Financing

Component 4: Project and Program Management

The proposed addition financing will focus on the repair, retrofitting and rebuilding of schools damaged by Tropical Cyclone Gita and strengthen the resilience of buildings and related infrastructure particularly for schools and health facilities and will finance additional five years of the Insurance premiums.
