4. Land banking guidelines prepared to operationalize the National Land Policy, National Urban Policy (NUA) and the Land Acquisition, Resettlement and Rehabilitation Policy.
5. Criteria and Guidelines for the national shared Infrastructure Corridors defined and developed.
