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Project Description

The project objective is to increase access to grades 1-4 in unserved areas with a focus on girls and to improve quality of instruction.

The proposed project will focus on establishing and strengthening systems at the FGS MoECHE and the FMS level, to successfully implement the government's ESSP. A key focus area will be to strengthen the stewardship role of the federal government, specifically as it relates to standard and policy setting in relation to teachers and school management and strengthening its role in monitoring of the sector. It will also focus on strengthening government capacity to coordinate sector activities through stronger intergovernmental engagement in the sector and to coordinate external support. To enable the federal government to effectively play a stewardship role for the sector, the project will invest in building the capacity of MoECHE to monitor sector outcomes effectively and strengthen education system governance and accountability. The support will be fully aligned with other efforts in the sector.
