The national survey measures almost every aspect of household welfare and serves as the foundation for monitoring economic and governance reforms, as well as the design, targeting, and monitoring of government and Bank programs and policies. It is essential for improving the Bank's ability to apply a poverty and equity lens to all of its operations.
