According to the Bank's website, the objective of this project is to enhance the effectiveness of fiscal policy, strengthen the investment climate and lay the foundations for greener growth.



### Early Warning System Project Analysis

The DPF is envisaged to have mostly positive environmental impacts and no significant adverse impacts on the environment, forests and natural resources are expected. The environmental impacts from the DPF reforms are expected to be positive, except for PA2 which may have potentially negative effects as a result of the construction of new pre-schools for the expansion of ECE services.
