Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the program development objectives are to provide reliable road access for efficient food supply logistics, and to strengthen road planning and asset management capacities.

Indonesia's Road Sector Development Program targets improved connectivity of its core network and better accessibility in underdeveloped and border areas to support both growth and equity. Key RSDP's priorities include (i) closing last-mile gaps in rural and lagging regions, including outermost and border areas, to ensure that remote communities are physically and economically connected; (ii) strengthening strategic logistics corridors linked to food production centers, energy and mineral downstreaming, and tourism destinations; (iii) improving the safety and resilience of the network; and (iv) building institutional capacity for regional road management, particularly at provincial and district levels that together manage the bulk of Indonesia's road network and are central to achieving more even development across all provinces. Besides underdeveloped and border areas, the Program will focus on food production areas and connectivity with transportation hubs.
