Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the objective of this project is to strengthen the institutional and technical capacities of Indigenous Peoples (IP), traditional Local Communities (LC), and their representative organizations to be aware of, understand, engage in and be positioned to benefit from carbon markets and land-linked performance-based climate finance.

The project is expected to strengthen the ability of IPs, traditional LCs, and their representative organizations to understand land, natural resource and carbon rights frameworks, assess the implications of carbon crediting, and take initial steps to translate this knowledge into territorial governance and community decision-making and action plans to engage. Key expected results include strengthened institutional and technical capacities, improved enabling environments, strengthened understanding of land and resource tenure and carbon-rights interfaces, and the development and early implementation of action plans reflecting vulnerable communities-defined priorities.
