According to the WB, the development objective is to enhance resilience to climate change and market access for farmers in the State of Espirito Santo.

The Project aims to advance sustainable, climate-resilient agriculture across the State of Espirito Santo, Brazil. It will strengthen family farming systems, enhance environmental management and restoration, and expand rural research, innovation, and infrastructure to improve market access. The project targets 25,000 family farmers, prioritizing women, youth, indigenous, and traditional communities. Expected outcomes include higher productivity, jobs creation, improved value-chain integration, adoption of sustainable rural technologies, and better environmental and agroecological services.
