Project Description

According to bank's website, the proposed project aims to support Uttarakhand's transformation towards reliable, efficient and financially sustainable water supply services, directly benefiting about 1.8 million people while establishing scalable systems for statewide improvement. The PforR will support professionalization of water service providers, performance-based service delivery, digital monitoring, reductions in non-revenue water and energy costs, stronger financial management and cost recovery, and improved climate resilience and source sustainability, while strengthening conditions for greater private participation and commercial financing. A small IPF component will finance selected strategic technical assistance for utility professionalization, long-term sector planning, digital transformation, transaction structuring and capacity building.
