### Project Description

According to the WB, the PBG will support Barbados' efforts to enhance economic growth, employment, and regional integration. The proposed operation is structured around two mutually reinforcing pillars, each targeting a distinct dimension of Barbados' structural reform agenda, and aims at introducing in the Caribbean a WBG credit enhancement structure that combines an International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD) first-loss Policy-Based Guarantee (PBG) of US\$ 110 million with a potential MIGA second-loss guarantee to raise up to US\$ 184 million equivalent in Barbadian dollar of commercial financing for Barbados.
