Project Description

According to bank's website, the proposed project is part of the World Bank-financed Regional Air Quality Management (AQM) Program in the Indo-Gangetic Plain and Himalayan Foothills (IGP-HF) region, which supports Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal, and Pakistan in institutional strengthening, emissions reduction, and regional knowledge exchange, forming the foundation of airshed management across the region. In India, the IGP covers around 18 percent of the country's land area and nearly 40 percent of its population, where rapid urbanization and economic growth have driven substantial emissions from transport, industry, road dust, and construction activities, making it a global air pollution hotspot. This project aims to strengthen air quality management (AQM) and reduce air pollutant emissions from transport in Delhi NCT.
