Project Description

According to bank's website, the proposed project aims to improve the delivery and uptake of a convergent package of nutrition-specific and nutrition-sensitive services among women, adolescent girls, and young children in six high-burden districts, with a particular focus on the critical first 1,000 days from conception to a child's second birthday. The operation comprises three mutually reinforcing components: (1) strengthening access to and quality of primary health care for nutrition-specific services through better-equipped facilities, capable frontline workers, reliable supplies, outreach, and referral systems; (2) improving household uptake of nutrition-sensitive services through community nutrition platforms, diversified food production, water and hygiene practices, social protection linkages, and early-childhood interventions; and (3) strengthening multisectoral governance, accountability, data systems, and project management to support coordinated delivery and course correction. The principal beneficiaries will be pregnant and lactating women, adolescent girls, children under two, and vulnerable households in six selected high-burden districts, while improvements in primary health care services will also benefit the broader population in those districts.
