Project Description

The proposed RPG is a harmonized and dynamic digital regional methodological framework (toolkit) to improve migration indicators in the Household Surveys (HS) and embodied in a manual of recommendations, and techniques and procedures that allow quantifying and mitigating the impact of the dynamism of sociodemographic phenomena, especially migration, on HS and population projections. Additionally, recommendations for intercensal periods will be included. The National Statistical Offices (NSO) of the countries will jointly develop these tools, which will become a fundamental basis for the design and implementation of more effective policies in the documentation and registration of migrants, water and sanitation, housing, social protection, health, education and employment and enable migrants to participate in the digital transformation (basis for digital public services).
