## Project Description

The EBRD is considering arranging an A/B loan of EUR 126 million to Hrvatska Elektroprivreda d.d. (HEP), Croatia's national energy company. The EBRD's portion of the proposed syndicated loan will be up to EUR 65 million.

According to bank documents, the loan proceeds will predominantly be used for the financing of construction works and the installation of the required equipment, all of which will be procured under the EBRD's procurement policies and rules.
