Project Description

The main objective of this program is to strengthen the Strategic Management of State (GEE) of El Salvador, with emphasis on the generation of reliable and timely information for use in planning, monitoring and evaluation of public policy information. Its specific objectives are: (i) improve the timeliness and reliability of the production of statistical information to support the GEE; (ii) improve the targeting of public policies based on socio-demographic information; and (iii) improve planning in order to capture and better articulate the challenges of development in national, sectoral, territorial and institutional dimensions.



Investment Description

- Inter-American Development Bank (IADB)

The proposed project cost is US\$50 million, US\$45 million of which would be financed by an investment loan from the IADB, and US\$5 million of which would be country counterpart financing.
