## Project Description

The operation will support among other activities: (i) Institutional strengthening of the Vector Borne Diseases Department of the Public Health Bureau which includes modernizing systems, processes and equipment in order to enhance service delivery in addressing vector borne diseases in urban areas as well as isolated villages in the Interior (ii) Institutional Strengthening of the Ministry of Health (MOH), especially in the areas of surveillance, data collection and analysis to assist the MOH to develop evidence based policies and provide targeted solutions for challenges identified within their public health programs (iii) Implementation of innovative and cost effective interventions to address the three prevalent NCDs in Suriname: hypertension, cancer and diabetes (iv) Small physical renovations to primary health care centers to facilitate improved screening and early detection of NCDs
