This project is in response to the need for a commercially-sustainable solution to the global water and sanitation challenge, the Fund will aggregate and deploy \$150 million in social investment capital to microfinance institutions (“MFIs”) and other inclusive financial intermediaries to scale up their water and sanitation (“WSS”) lending portfolios (the “Project”). This Fund size will include a \$100,000,000 loan from DFC.
