Thus, these entities will be able to implement advanced analyzes with massive data that contribute to: (i) improve decision-making and elaboration of sectoral public policies based on evidence; (ii) to develop common diagnoses at the country level; And (iii) foster collaboration among government agencies to develop multisectoral policies in a sustainable manner over time.
