## Project Description

To support the Paraguayan Institute of Handicrafts (IPA by its Spanish acronym) in the design and development of tools for inclusive development and sustainable use of natural resources to prepare the National Policy of Handicrafts and the National Plan of Handicrafts. Specifically, this TC will facilitate IPA: i) the participatory design of a policy to support and protect Paraguayan culture that will include incentives for sustainable use of natural resources and women empowerment; and ii) design of a strategy for the implementation of the national policy for handicrafts that will include the preparation of specific public investment projects.
