## Project Description

This project focuses on the introduction of new business models based on integrated and diversified use of forest resources (timber and non-timber) to increase productivity and production quality. It also focuses on the assurance of environmental sustainability of forests through a clear system of incentives for the management and conservation of forest resources. This includes product certification, improvement of capacities of agroforestry cooperatives, access to finance and working capital for businesses.



## Investment Description

The IADB has approved a loan of US\$1,000,000 to this project. The total project cost is US\$2,040,930, of which country counterpart financing accounts for US\$1,040,930.
