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## Project Description

The development objective of Emergency Health Project is to support the government of Jordan in maintaining the delivery of primary and secondary health services to poor uninsured Jordanians and Syrian refugees at Ministry of Health (MOH) facilities. This project has two components. 1) Results-based financing to deliver health care services at primary and secondary health care facilities of MOH to the target population, will pay for services utilized by the target population at MOH facilities nationwide. This component is divided into two sub-components as follows: (i) Results-based financing for the delivery of primary health care services to target populations; and (ii) Results-based financing for the delivery of secondary health care services to target populations. 2) Independent verification and institutional capacity building to improve efficiency of health services delivered, has two subcomponents as follows: (i) Independent verification of expenditures incurred and utilization of services by project beneficiaries and auditing of financial statements; and (ii) Capacity building to monitor and improve efficiency.
