Project Description

According to the project document, "the objective of the project is to enhance the resilience of the lives and livelihoods of the most vulnerable populations, particularly women, in the coastal areas of India to climate change and extreme events, using an ecosystem-centred and community-based approach. The project will work at national, state, and community levels to enhance capacity for ecosystem and community-based approaches to adaptation and enable pathways to replication and scale beyond the project to all of India's coastal states. Specific restoration and livelihood interventions will be undertaken in the target states of Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra and Odisha, with learning shared across all coastal states and their districts, and more widely in the South Asian region."
