## Project Description

In particular, a series of interviews with key actors of the Chilean ecosystem are expected to be held in order to strengthen Uruguay's innovation instruments, incorporate new topics such as climate change and green hydrogen, identify new lines of work for entrepreneurship, incorporate a gender approach in research and public programs, among other related activities.
