## Project Description

The main objective of the TC is to support the Ministry of Economy and Finance (MEF) of the Republic of Haiti in the strengthening of its capabilities and knowledge for the fiscal management of State-Owned Enterprises (SOEs) and their investment framework. To achieve these objectives this TC will finance three types of activities: (i) Deepen and update the diagnostics of the current state of the governance and investment frameworks of the State-Owned Enterprises to identify courses of action for their improvement and strengthening; (ii) Analysis and evaluation of the design and management of the fiscal regimes for SOEs' productive activities in Haiti and their implications for fiscal sustainability; and (iii) Dissemination of knowledge and training to facilitate capacity building in the MEF.
